**Sermon Synopsis** ... Two of my favorite Bible stories: "Naaman's Wife's Maid" and "Andrew's Friend's Lunch." Naaman had leprosy—incurable, untreatable. Then his wife's maid—a foreigner—enters the story. "There is a prophet in my home country who has great power," she told Mrs. Naaman. "He could cure my lord's leprosy. I'm sure of it." Naaman, desperate, ready to grasp at any hope, persuades his king to send him to Israel in search of the miracle-working prophet. After more drama, Naaman is cured. He returns home a devotee of the God of Israel.

The second story begins with a crowd of five thousand plus hungry people and no nearby stores or restaurants. Jesus directs his disciples to feed the crowd, but the disciples point out that, even with all the necessary money in hand, there were no sources of groceries sufficient for this mass of hungry people. One of the disciples, Andrew, offers, "There's a boy here with a lunch, five barley loaves and a couple of fish. But what good is that for a crowd like this?" "Just have the people sit down," Jesus directed. The people sat in groups. Jesus took the boy's lunch, blessed it, then handed fish and bread to his disciples, reaching into the boy's basket over and over and over until he had pulled out enough food to feed everyone to satisfaction.

Let's honor our children and cooperate with God as he works in them and through them.
